- Spring break activities allowed guests to take a free test dive at The Scuba Tour 20'x40' pool at the Museum and learn about scuba diving from local diving professionals and Ocean Fest Dive and Adventure Sports Show representatives. Scuba Radio was also on hand for a live radio broadcast.
- 54 community partners participated in Museum annual events:
