



- Nearly 90,000 students and teachers made group visits to the Museum.
- 8,445 students attended Museum labs and demonstrations designed to augment classroom curriculum and complement our films and exhibits, a 13% increase over prior year.
- 1,865 science demonstrations were served at the Science Café.

- 1,002 children attended the Museum's camp programs and camp revenue increased by 17%.
- 14,193 students were served by the Museum-on-Wheels school outreach program, a 58% increase over prior year.
- The Sea Turtle Walks sold out with 575 participants and revenue increased by 18%.
- 1,960 youth enjoyed a night at the Museum in the Museum's overnight camp-in program. Camp-in revenue increased by 52%.
- 4,100 children and parents attended 118 birthday parties at the Museum.

- Museum's education staff trained 150 Broward County teachers in science curriculum development, hands-on activities and teaching techniques in areas of early childhood education, physical and biological science.
- The Community Foundation of Broward supported four high school students' participation in YATSEE (Youth Achievement through Science Enrichment and Employment), an earn-as-you-learn intern/mentorship program for inner-city high school students.
- Staff delivered 1,675 Animal Encounter programs to Museum visitors.
